IT IS UNLAWFUL TO ENTER AND DETAIN ANY INDIVIDUAL WITHOUT A WARRANT SIGNED BY A JUDGE.

WHAT TO DO IF ICE OR LAW ENFORCEMENT ATTEMPT TO ENTER A BUILDING

- Remain calm and assert your rights firmly.
- Do not open the door.
- Do not answer questions without consulting a lawyer.
- Request the names of the agents and their badge numbers.
- Do not sign anything.
- Take pictures, video, or write down: License plate numbers, description of the vehicles, number of agents, time, location, and what happened.





"I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution. I do not give you permission to enter my home or business based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door. I do not give you permission to search my

I do not give you permission to search my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights. I choose to exercise my constitutional rights."





- Do not open the door.
- Ask them to show it to you by sliding it under the door or holding it up to a window.
- Check the warrant for a signature from a judge, the correct date, correct address and name of who they are looking for.
- You do not have to open the door if the information is incorrect or missing.

DO NOT GO OUTSIDE UNTIL THE AGENT HAS DEPARTED
